The project was supported by artist Tracey Emin, who grew up in Margate. The building was designed by David Chipperfield Architects after Snà Ishetta + Spence abandoned the project. Construction began in 2008, but the project initiator, John Crofts, died in 2009. The Turner Contemporary Gallery officially opened on the 16th. April 2011. The Margate Jubilee Clock Tower was built to commemorate Queen Victoria's Golden Jubilee in 1887, although it was not completed until 1889. It was equipped with a time-sphere mechanism, mounted on a tree at the top of the tower, which was lifted a few minutes before 1 p.m. each day and dropped at 1 p.m., allowing locals, visitors and ships to know the exact time. The time sphere fell out of use many years ago, but the Margate Civic Society raised funds to repair it and put it back into use. This was successful, and a civic ceremony celebrated the restoration on the 24th. May 2014, Queen Victoria's birthday and 125th anniversary of the official opening of the Clock Tower.
