Arnor, or Northern Kingdom, was a kingdom of the DÅ²nedain in the land of Eriador, in the middle earth. It was the original office of the Supreme King of Arnor who ruled both Arnor and Gondor. [Edit _ Change Wikitesto]
Arnor geography included most of the Eriador, which extended from the Gulf of Lune (west of Lindon) to the Greyflood river and its tributary, the Loudwater River (east of Rivendell). Arnor's Dunedain lived in many restaurants of the Eriador, but most of the population focused around the Arthedain region. The Danedain mainly lived the cities of Fondost and the capital of AnnÅfominas, as well as along the Baranduin and the Gulf of Lune. Ancient History
Before the Arnor Foundation, the Eriador was the home of media of Edain's lineage. As a result of the slow emigration began under the noun Tar-Meneldur and Tar-Aldarion, a consistent population was formed. These first settlers soon crossed with the indigenous population of the Eriador. The faithful preferred the Eriador with respect to the most southern regions (Gondor) because the elves of Lindon, under their supreme king Gil-Galat, lived very close to the River LhÅfÅ «n. [2]: 360 on the contrary. The king's men settled southerners in the last days. So, the area was populated by people who were mostly faithful and friends of Elves, where much of the knowledge of the elderly days was preserved. Steven White Jr.
Ominas Palace Complex during the fall of NÅ Omenor, Elendil and the people of him sail through the Gulf of Lune and climbed the River Lune, and made friendship with the supreme king of Noldor
Gil-Galad. [2] Both Elmedil and the sons of him were by the Men who were in all or part of the blood of the name,[2][3]
These men of Eriador accepted the new kingdom of Elendil and helped the people and the maintenance of the manythat the Northern DÅ²onedain was built. [2]
Bree's men also became subjects of Arnor. [3]
Gil-Galad and his people helped the kingdom of fire; He even built the Emyr Beraid for Elenil. [2]
Elendil founded Arnor at the end of the second age (S.A. 3320), while his sons merge the southern kingdom of Gondor. Both kingdoms of the Númenters were known as the kingdoms in exile, and their history is interwoven. Despite his precedence over it as the seat of the high king, Arnor was never powerful and populous as Gondor. [4]
Elenil established the city of AnnÅ2minas as its capital. In addition to the main cities such as Annúminas and Fornost, Arnor's men concentrated around the Lhåo and Baranduin, Rhudaur's hills, and built towers on Amon SÅ «l. [2] [edit]
War of the last Alliance
Isifur in Fellowship of Peter Jackson of the Ring in S.A. 3430
Arnor joined Gil-Galdur in a great alliance. When Elendil led his people against Sauron, DÅ²oDain and other Eriador men marched together south. [2]
In conjunction with the southern forces of Gondor, they confronted the armies of Sauron in the war of the last alliance. This great war lasted several years, which reached Dagorlad and Mordorous far south, culminating in the siege of Barad-Då «r. Both Elenil and his son AnÅ¹rion were killed in this conflict, but Isildur cut the ring from Sauron's finger and took hold. Isildur (who was also the king of the gondor) was the eldest son of Elenil and would inherit the high gift and throne of Arnor. But he never reached his new kingdom: he was killed in T.a. 2
In the disastrous disaster of Gladden camps, as well as its three older children; The ring was also lost there. The fourth and younger son of Isildur, Valandil, who had remained in Rivendell because of his youth, became his heir (T.A. 10). But Arnor's men suffered heavy casualties in the war and in the subsequent disaster; Now it remained too few people and the places that Elendil had built became partially unpopulated. Arnor has never been fully recovered from devastating losses. [2]
For neither valandil nor his later heirs supported the throne of Gondor (at least until Arddossi's attempt), the kingdoms were divided; But while the ruler of Arnor retained the title high king in practice were only king of arnor, and had no power over the south-reign. AnÅ¹rion and his heirs did not make any complaints about the north-reign and they were in style simply as king of Gondor. [edit]
Breakup, Decline and War with Angmar
Arnor's Capital was AnnÅominas on Lake Evendim, but from T.a. 861
Fornost Erain had taken his place. It is no longer a site of such importance, AnnÅ2Minas disappeared and was slowly abandoned. After the death of his tenth king, E...rendur, in T.a. 861, Arnor was shaken by the civil war between his three sons. The eldest, Amlaith, said Kinghip to all the Arnors, but it was reduced only to dominate the Arthedain region of his kingdom, while the other sons merge the kingdoms fleeing Cardolan and Rhudaur. [5] [2] [6]. The three kingdoms often concern themselves, usually over the control of the weather hills and the Palantår of Amon SÅ «l. [6]
Eliot Gould - the witch king who saw the disunion to arnor, during the reign of malvegilio (c. T.a. 1300), the witch king of Angmar sipped in the north, later identified as in reality the Lord of the Ringuronths. This new threat began to attack RhuDaur and Cardolan. [6]
In the end the line of Isildur failed in the other kingdoms, but Arthedain and the DÅ²oDain were few in Rhudaur, where a man-men lord, secretly supporting Angmar, the seized power. ARNOR was refuted by Jure of the seventh king of Arthedain,I, and Cardolan was placed under his Suzerainty but Rhudaur resisted. Arthedain has therefore reaffirmed control over the Cardolan but in response, a line a line along the hills of time, but Rhudaur and Angmar attacked and killed the king in T.a. 1356. Him of him Arveleg I, however, however, Concurrently with Cardolan and Lindon and pushed back the enemy. [6]

Arveleg continued to hold the border along the hills for the following years, until T.A. 1409, when Angmar crossed the Hoarwell and successfully captured Weathertop successfully, and Arveleg fell in battle, as did the last Prince of Cardolan (later played in the bars). [7]. Amon SÅÅ² fell, and his PalantÅ¹r was brought to Fornost. With Amon SÅÅ² l lost, Angmar had free reign on the lands of Cardolan, which was devastated, and the population was forced to resist in the wheelbarrow, or took refuge in the old forest. Rhudaur was occupied by evil Men subject to Angmar and the remaining DÅ²oDain were killed or flee to West. [6]
The Bîro, once the hunting grounds of the King of Arnor, was a fertile and well-cultivated part of Arnor, abandoned during the waning days of the Arthedain. The Hobbits (who had lived in Dunland and parts of Donlands (Cardolan and RhuDaur) obtained official permission from King Arveleg II to settle the lands. This was finally done in t.a. 1601 by Bree-Hobbit led by brothers Markio and Blanco; Almost all Earth's hobbits of Earth could be found there within 30 years later. The Hore-Hobbits considered themselves subjects of the King of Arthedain, at least nominally, considering their country's isolation. However, they sent some troops to support the great Arnor battles fought against Angmar. [6]
Arnor's men did not have the strength to drive away Angmar's forces, so Lindon's elves, Rivendell's forces, and the Galadhrim defeats Angmar's armies much later. [6] [edit]
The great plague
Amir Salehi - Servant of Death
Another threat appeared in the northern kingdoms, the great plague that came from the East. Arnor's men were so impressed by the fact that the joint garrison at Tharbad which Arnor held with Gondor ceased to exist, [8] and the last of Cardolan's DÅ²oDain died on the sticks. The Witch King, taking advantage of the tragedy, sent the evil spirits, the barrow-wights, to infuse the area. Shire's folk was damaged by it, but not heavily. The plague lost its force, however, at this point, so that most of Arthedain was not affected. [6]
The two kingdoms in exile eventually suspect that these disasters could be coordinated by a single power and resumed communications. As a result, Prince Arvecchi, the heir to the scepter, married FÅ¹riel, the daughter of King Ondoher of Gondor (T.a. 1940). This happened before Oldoher was killed in battle, and hoping to save his kingdom, Ardduei pointed his claim to Gondor, based on his descent from Elenil and from that of his wife. The Council of Gondor refused reunification and the king, King Eårmil II, maintained good relations with ARNOR, promising help against Angmar. But Arnor's strength was scaled back; in 1973 Arvedui (now King) sent a message to Gondor that Angmar was preparing his final assault, and EÅ¹nil was picking up a large weaponry for Lindon, but it would have come too late. The fall of Arthedain
In T.a. 1974, the final chapter in Arthedain's history began. The Witch King attacked during the harsh winter weather. The capital of Fornost fell, and the remaining armory forces were driven up the Moon River at Lindon. [6]
Aranarh escaped across the border, while his son, Aranarh, informed Gondan of the disaster at Grey Havens. The sailors of CÅ¹rden were ultimately unable to save Arvecchi, and Malbeth's prophecy of the seer at his birth, who would be the last king of Arthedain, was fulfilled. [edit]
Showdown with Angmar
The gondoran naval forces under EÅ¹rnur, the captain of Gondor finally landed in the Gray Havens, from I'm going to have the most powerful army seen in northern Middle-earth. The remnants of Arnor will join following the great force, led by Cirdan and EÅ¹rnur, in the largest joint Elf-Man army since the war of the last alliance; This great guest from the West has marched north-north. the Arnorian capital of Fornost, where the sorcerer king had occupied. He trusted his forces to meet them in the open. The army attacked him from the hills of Evendim, and a great battle broke out. The cavalry led by EÅ¹rnur followed what remained of the Angmar forces, and was reached by a elven force commanded by Glorfindel of Rivendell. Angmar fell, but the King Witch fled. So Arthedain and Angmar were destroyed. I DÅ²onedain of Arnor created new houses in the Angle south of Rivendell, but Aranarh understood that his people had become too few after the continuous wars to restore the kingdom. Some men survived Bree and other villages, while the Hobbits survived in Shire and Bree; in Shire they chose a Thain to replace the fallen king in 1979. The County remained a lesser but independent political unity.[10] [edit]
Rangers of the northern Aranarh, instead of calling himself king or prince, assumed the title of Cape and took his people in decline, now vagrant secrets that traveled from one place to another of the Eriador. His son, Arahael, grew up healthy and saved in Rivendell under the custody of Elrond, a tradition followed for the rest of the Third Era. In Elrond were also brought the relics of the house of Isildur: The Scettro di Annominas, the Ring of Barahir, the fragments of Narsil and the Star of Elendil. Thus, through them, the royal house of Isildur was successfully maintained as a father to a son for a millennium. In Eriador there were sixteen captains in direct descent, under many dangers, and many of them died of premature death. One of these was Arathorn II, killed by the Orcs who plundered the area. Thus the DÅ²onedain survived in the shadows, waiting for a better day when the kingdom would be reborn, that is, at the time of Aragorn, on May 1, T.A. 3019. [edit]
War of the Ring
The Kingdom of Arnor had fallen for a thousand years when the Ring War broke out, but the forces of the North participated in the war. Aragorn participated in it, the heir of Isildur, and there were several hundred of them operating during the conflict. The company A of this group accompanied Aragorn along the Paths of the Dead and during the attack on Umbar that conquered the fleet Corsair. They participated in the last battle, fighting under his flag, in the battle of Morannon, where Sauron was finally defeated. There have been conflicts in other parts of the North. There were three different invasions of LothlÅ³rien, which were rejected by the elve army commanded by Celeborn and Thranduil. Finally, Celeborn led an attack that led to the capture of Dol Guldur and ended the northern threat of Sauron. There was also a battle fought in the County, between the Ruffians of Saruman and the forces of Hobbit militia. This was the last battle fought in the Ring War, and led to the death of Saruman and the capture of his followers. This became known as the Battle of Bywater, and represents the contribution of the Hobbits to the war.[11] [edit] [edit]
Rowena Morrill - The last Steward of Gondor
Faramir, son of Denethor II, the last reigning Steward, presented his stick to the new king and received it from him. Aragorn II was crowned by Gandalf as king Elessar, and renamed the Kingdom of Arnor as part of the United Kingdom, and made AnnÅominas his new capital.[12]
He married Princess Elfa Arwen, who became the Evenstar Queen of Arnor and Gondor. After the fall of Sauron Arnor was again sure for the men's settlement, and although he remained less populated than Gondor to the south, with time Arnor returned to be a more densely populated region, although his size had reduced due to the independence of Shire. The area included in the UK now included the territory of the two kingdoms in their maximum extension. In the North, this included all the land between Lune and the Nebbiose Mountains, and inSouth has included the whole earth between Dunland in the West, up to the far Harad towards the south, to RkÅ² å å º " n east. Languages
Many people in Arnor were of NÅ²MenMenÅfÅ²rean stock. However, apart from the exiles, most had long since they mixed with NordenÅ²rean peoples. The predominant language spoken by them was Westron. [13]
At least some of the populations, especially the upper classes, were fluent in Sindarin, while Quenya was studied as a language of tradition. Many names of the first places and the names of the Royal House were quenya, but with the 8th century of the third age, Quenya had left the place to Sindarin. [edit]
Arnor etymology
was the colloquial name for the Northern Kingdom. The Kingdom of the North, as the Earth was called to his conception, was also known as Tenomeno Follondieé in Quenya and Arthor na Forlonnas in Sindarin. These names have decreased quickly out of order, in favor of Arnor: the land of the king, called the so-called elenil's regality, and to seal the priority of him on the southern kingdom. In full, poetic Sindarin, it was called Aranannor, which reflects his name of Quenya, ArudÅfÅ²rÅf Å «. [14]
Although technically ArudÅfÅ²rÅf Å «would have a form of Sindarin Ardor, Tolkien chose Arnor because it sounded better. This linguistic change has been attributed later, sindarin's kind development. [15] [16]
